

Fire Lighting Tips

- Place 2 medium pieces of wood (as thick as your wrist) on the base of the fireplace parallel about two hand widths apart.
- Loosen 4-5 sheets of newspaper; tear into strips, separate all pages and crunch into a loose ball shape and place between the 2 medium sized pieces of wood.
- Set small twigs and sticks over the newspaper so when the paper burns they will fall across the first 2 medium pieces of wood.
- Stack small sticks and medium timber around and over the small twigs and paper so they also bridge the first two pieces of wood. As the fire burns down this will allow air to draft up between them.
- Light the fire, and leave the fireplace door just open till the fire gets going to allow better airflow. When the fire is well established, close the door and sure the vent lever is in the open position to the far right.
- Watch the fire closely for the first 20 minutes gradually increasing the size of wood, pacing each new piece of wood across the last.
- Never put wood side by side on the fire, as this will reduce airflow.
- To increase the heater's efficiency after the fire is established, move the lever a little to the left.

WARNING

Please don't allow wood to touch the glass door.

Don't stack wood on top of the fireplace as it can start burning or create heavy smoke.

Allow the fire to burn out at least 1 hour before you check out.
